Responsible Research


- Immense benefits to quality of care
- Serious consequences if done poorly or in violation of standards
 - Example: Research can be shut down at a Hospital (many examples)
 - Example: Lawsuits





Pathways to responsible research

- Engaged Principal Investigator (research mentor)
- Start early
- Research Institute
- Data management & best practices
- Conduct a **feasibility assessment**:
 - Sample Size
 - GANTT Chart







Research Citizenship: Staffing appropriately, Collaboration and Research Team Roles



Who to Involve in your Research

- Principal Investigator: ALWAYS NEEDED
- NCHS Regulatory Affairs: ALWAYS NEEDED
- Sub-investigators (e.g., fellows, residents, other faculty physicians): SOMETIMES NEEDED
- Administrative staff: SOMETIMES NEEDED
- Clinical Research Coordinators: SOMETIMES NEEDED
- Research Pharmacists: OCCASIONALLY NEEDED
- Research Data Manager: OCCASIONALLY NEEDED (unless that is you as the fellow)
- Biostatistician: SOMETIMES NEEDED
- Contract specialist: OCCASIONALLY NEEDED



Roles of the Research Team: Principal Investigator/Mentor

- Engaged in the research
- Identifies unmet needs/gaps in the literature
- Reviews and provides feedback to fellow/resident
- Aids in identification of relevant data
- Considers different study designs
- Assures following of research protocol
- Monitors timely progress on project
- Reviews data analysis and results interpretation
- Provides feedback on abstracts, posters, presentations, and manuscripts
- Reviews relevant documents and maintains involvement in the study
- Much more....





Fellow/Resident

- Seeks out relevant team members for study (collaborators)
- Conducts thorough literature reviews
- Writes protocol
- Executes research protocol
- Ensures accurate data collection
- Prepares abstracts, presentations, and manuscripts





Biostatistician Role

- If your planned study requires more than basic descriptive statistics, please consult RAD:
 - RAD@Nicklaushealth.org
 - https://redcap.mch.com/surveys/?s=7C3HDDM7JK
- RAD can provide guidance on data management practices
- This person is responsible for
 - Aiding in planning analyses
 - Writing up methods and results
 - Building surveys in REDCap
 - Data extraction from EMR data (when available)
 - Reviewing results with study team
 - ***Reviewing abstracts, presentations, and manuscripts before submission***





Clinical Research Coordinator Role (CRC)

- If your study interacts directly with patients, families or other "human subjects", you likely will need to at least discuss the need for a CRC (<u>ClinicalResearch@Nicklaushealth.org</u>)
- Note: Residents and fellows generally do not participate in prospective clinical trials

- Role of a CRC
 - Obtain informed consent/assent
 - Help execute prospective studies





Clinical Research Pharmacist


• If your study at all involves off-label use of a drug, investigational drug products, or other non-standard use of medications, you will need to consult a Clinical Research Pharmacist within NCRI

(ClinicalResearch@Nicklaushealth.org)



- Plans use of investigational drugs
- Oversees use/administration of investigational drugs
- Consults on considerations of off-label use of medications (this protects you, the fellow or resident)






Research Costs and Budgets



Research is not free

- Someone is paying for research to happen
 - Example: CRCs and Clinical Research Pharmacists currently have a direct cost
- Who is paying for the time of each individual on your team?
 - My service line's budget
 - Industry sponsor (e.g., Pharmaceutical Company)
 - Grants





Intervention Research is not Standard of Care

• Non-Standard of Care cannot be charged to insurance.

- Don't put your career or the hospital at risk by trying to charge insurance companies or Medicaid for your research
- Interventions or medications for research purposes require funding

• When in doubt consult both your PI and the Research Institute






Authorship



Study Authorship Guidance


- NCHS has an authorship policy: if someone contributes to a study, they should be recognized.
- Activities that warrant authorship in most circumstances:
 - 1. Write portions of manuscripts
 - 2. Conduct portions of the study protocol
 - 3. Work with the data at all
 - 4. Conduct statistical analyses
- When in doubt, initiate discussion with research team--early.






Authorship Order


