# FIVE WAYS TO CHAMPION

- 3. Educate

#1 - Awareness & Opened **Discussion About Diversity & Inclusion Goals** 

- ♦ TALK: Address issues of sexism, racism, bias, intolerance head-on (Through an open and honest conversation)
- **UNDERSTAND:** Seek to understand the diversity & inclusion goals of the organization and how they connect to your work
- **REFLECT:** Think about inclusion and how well you solicit, encourage, and embrace new ideas and different perspectives.

## #2 - Broaden Your Definition of Diversity

- ♦ Go broad, beyond race, gender, and sexual orientation
- Think about other characteristics e.g. education, physical and mental ability, life experiences, political views, appearance, risk tolerance, and exposure to different cultures
- Conduct an audit (selfreflection) on which diversity

- elements are present within yourself and within your team? Ask yourself if what you are saying or doing is respectful
- Acknowledge that diversity exists everywhere and in many forms (Diversity is Diverse)

### #3 - Educate

- ◆ Education is key to improving diversity
- ♦ The more messaging the more guidance provided, the better
- Examine personal bias and identify stereotypes
- ♦ Review policies and work practices
- ♦ Improve your cultural competency by learning about your team, inviting speakers, enroll in courses
- ♦ If you are not sure about something, ask, seek to learn
- ♦ Educate people on the ad-

# #4 - Apply the Inclusion Lens

- Benefits of diversity are realized when everyone feels they can bring their unique self to work and contribute meaningfully all day, every day, without any fear of judgement
- ◆ Think about how inclusive your everyday practices are
- How feedback is solicited?
   Can people feel comfortable to contribute ideas anonymously or through means other than face-to-face
- Encourage people to think about and share times when

they felt their voice wasn't heard, when they were intimidated, or even excluded

#### #5 - Promote & Celebrate

- Diversity & inclusion efforts should be fun
- Promoting and celebrating diversity sends a clear and loud message that diversity is important
- Learn about different holidays, and decide which ones are appropriate to celebrate at work. Find out special days that people want to celebrate
- Get involved in community events that promote diverse groups
- Celebrate progress on your diversity goals.

Whether it is top-down, bottom -up, or right through the middle, diversity and inclusion efforts can thrive and flourish with enough attention.

Sandy Chung, MD, FAAP, is the 2023 President of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP). Pediatrician Dr. Sandy Chung has held over 30 state and national leadership positions, including AAP Virginia Chapter President and Founder and Medical Director of the Virginia Mental Health Access Program. She is the CEO of Trusted Doctors, a pediatric practice of over 180 clinicians in Virginia. DC, and Maryland and serves as Medical Director of Informatics at Children's National Hospital's Pediatric Health Network. Her passionate advocacy for child health and pediatricians has delivered major advancements in healthcare equity, mental health, EHR burden reduction, appropriate payment, physician well-being, and optimal child health policies.

She is the recipient of multiple awards including the March of Dimes Lifetime Heroine Award recognizing a lifetime of community volunteerism, the Clarence A. Holland Award for providing outstanding contributions to the community and demonstrating leadership in the field of political advocacy, and the Virginia Chapter Child Advocate Award for standing up for the rights, values, and recognition of Virginia's children.

As an avid educator of the next generation of pediatricians, her publications include articles on telemedicine, virtual learning, and health information technology. Dr. Chung received her medical degree from the University of Virginia and completed her pediatric residency at the Inova L.J. Murphy Children's Hospital. She has appeared in numerous outlets including Post, the Washington Wall Street Journal, NPR, Washington Business Journal, Virginia Business Magazine, Contemporary Pediatrics, and AAP News. Dr. Chung is the proud mother of four amazing children who teach her something new every day.


The 5th Annual Dr. Sanjiv Bhatia Memorial Lecture

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
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
