### Compliance Corner - 2024 Split/Shared Services

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#### **Background:**

The Centers for Medicare & **A** Medicaid Services (CMS) have m refined several longstanding in Split/Shared Evaluation and th Management (E/M) visit policies, pr with the implementation dates th being November 22, 2023, and the latest revision effective from January 1, 2024.

**A** Split/Shared visit refers to a medically necessary encounter in a facility setting where both the physician and non-physician practitioner (NPP) who are in the same group each perform a substantive portion of an E/M

Split/Shared Timeline

visit on the same date of service with the same patient, but only one practitioner bills for the service.

# Compliance Corner

Additional services eligible for Split/Shared billing, such as Critical Care, New

- 2022 & 2023
- Patient, Initial Inpatient Hospital, and Prolonged Services.
  Updated rule defining what constitutes a substantive portion, face-to-face contact requirements, and new Split/Shared modifier -FS.

## Starting January 1, 2024

Based on the Final Rule, "substantive portion" means more than half of the total time spent by the physician and NPP performing the split (or shared) visit, or a substantive part of the medical decision making (MDM). <u>Performing a substantive part of the MDM requires that the physician or NPP makes or approves the plan of care and assumes the responsibility for the patient.</u>

Medical Record Documentation: The medical record must identify the physician and NPP who performed the visit and contain medical necessity for the split (or shared) visit.

If the substantive portion is based on time, each practitioner must document their visit time using the following attestation:

 I Dr. (or NPP) XXXX saw and evaluated the patient, I personally spent XX minutes including assessing and managing the patient and counseling, educating, communicating results to the patient/family/caregiver.

If the substantive portion is based on MDM, the billing practitioner must document the components that they performed regarding the medical decision making <u>or</u> add the following attestation:

 I, Dr. XXX (or NPP XXX), (performed or approved) the critical key elements of the service and personally participated in the diagnosis and management plan.

## NCH Trainees & Faculty Continue to Disseminate Their Scholarly Work in Print and on National Stages


#### **Hot Off the Press**

After the initial work up in the ED he was transferred to 2N for observation to make sure that, following the repeated emesis his sugar stabilizes and he is safe to continue learning new skills in Miami. I became involved to assist with the Polish interpretation (as being from Poland and a certified Polish interpreter) as the mom became overwhelmed by the stress of what was happening and found it difficult to communicate beyond the basic conversational English.

Once Dr. San Martin found out that the family, being covered by a standard tourist insurance (it only covers urgent/ emergency care) was not going to be able to do the recommended follow up with outpatient pediatrician office (they are not going back to the home country for another month) she offered to do a quick check in with Igor via WhatsApp, which I helped to facilitate. It was a great to see him all recovered and ready to rumble, recognize the doctor that took care of him smiling, and vigorously waving his hand at Dr. San Martin.

Dr. San Martin was one of the several wonderful docs taking care of Igor, and with her warmth and approach made such impression on Igor's family that they wanted to make sure I send their recognition of her to appropriate leadership.

I am happy to report that, according to the family, their experience at NCH was, after the initial stress wore off, comparable to Ritz Carlton. They mentioned everyone, from the security guard at the ED entrance, the ED staff, 2N staff and especially Dr. San Martin as professional and at the same time warm, and caring. Even things that we take for granted, such as specialized diet menu (the patient is gluten free and grain free), or both mom and grandma being allowed to stay with the child overnight, they marveled about. I will spare you the comparison with the socialized medical care that they are used to in Poland for expediency reasons.

To summarize, there will be tales told about NCH and Dr. San Martin in Poland". Congratulations Stephanie on a job well done!!!
