

## HELPING CHILDREN WITH GENETIC DISORDERS

The visa lottery win that enabled Leidybeth Rodriguez and her family to leave their native Cuba was much more than a ticket out of a troubled country. For Leidybeth, it was a chance for a complete medical turnaround.

Leidybeth has Gaucher disease, a genetic disorder caused by an enzyme deficiency. The disease results in weakness, anemia, the tendency to bruise and bleed, bone degeneration and enlargement of the liver and spleen.

Although Leidybeth was diagnosed at age 7, she did not receive proper management until she arrived in Florida at age 11. The doctors at Miami Children's Hospital placed her on medication that has changed her life.

"Before I had no energy and would lie around all the time," said Leidybeth, a Miami-Dade Community College student who also works at a bank. "There's no way I could work and go to school without this treatment."

#### Help for children with genetic disorders

The Division of Clinical Genetics and Metabolism at Miami Children's provides expert diagnosis, counseling and treatment of children with a wide range of conditions. The team commonly evaluates infants and children with developmental delays, unusual facial features, metabolic disorders, seizures, craniofacial anomalies or babies who fail to thrive.

### The regional leader in genetic services

Miami Children's Division of Clinical Genetics and Metabolism is the largest provider of clinical genetic services in the region. The team sees patients from throughout Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach and Monroe counties. Care is offered at Miami Children's Hospital's main campus near Coral Gables as well as at the Miami Children's Hospital Dan Marino Center in Weston.

#### Helping parents plan ahead

The Division of Clinical Genetics and Metabolism also offers genetic counseling to help parents of children with abnormalities plan for future pregnancies. The team gathers detailed information regarding medical and family history, and assesses the risk for potential offspring as well as options for genetic testing.

### Specialty programs and clinics

For children with genetic disorders, the division has developed specialty programs and clinics that offer patients the convenience of care from multiple specialists:

*Neurofibromatosis Center:* This center evaluates and manages children with suspected or confirmed diagnosis for Neuro-fibromatosis. Families are provided with the most current information related to treatment and research and receive ongoing management.

*Craniofacial Center:* The Division of Clinical Genetics and Metabolism is also home to the region's state-designated Craniofacial Center, which offers care for children with craniofacial anomalies. This program offers diagnosis, management and reconstructive surgery to support the care of children with craniofacial differences.

*Neurogenetic/Metabolic Program:* Children with neurogenetic/ metabolic disorders require treatment from many subspecialists. This program – which is offered in association with the hospital's Brain Institute – brings together a broad group of specialists to provide convenient and comprehensive care.

*Lysosomal Storage Disease Center:* The center brings together a broad-based multidisciplinary team to care for children with lysosomal storage disorders, complex diseases that affect many different organs. For more information, call 305-663-8595.

"This system enables us to keep a record of all who enter the facility and their destination. Through it we hope to offer guests and staff peace of mind that we are taking advantage of the latest security advances," said Alan Sheffield, Director of Safety and Security at Miami Children's.

Miami Children's selected the FAST-PASS identification system created by Sisco Identification Solutions of West Palm Beach, Florida, which enables guests to obtain badges quickly and efficiently.

Guests are asked to provide a photo identification upon arrival at any hospital entrance. The identification card is scanned and then an adhesive photo badge is generated for the guest. Children entering the hospital wear badges bearing their parent's name and likeness.

"In our increasingly security-conscious world, it is expected that most hospitals will soon initiate similar systems," said Sheffield. "We are pleased to be at the forefront among South Florida hospitals."
