

MIAMI CHILDREN'S BRAIN INSTITUTE IS FIRST PROGRAM OF ITS KIND IN NATION

Jacqueline Massaro does not believe in coincidence. In her mind, everything happens for a reason. The St. Lucie County mother is convinced that fate intervened to keep some of the Northeast's topranked pediatric hospitals from discovering her son's brain tumor.

"As a result of their oversight, we were in the hands of the best when Marco had his surgery. We were meant to be at the Miami Children's Brain Institute for his care. It's that simple," she said.

Marco was approximately 8 months old and the family was still residing in Pennsylvania when the formerly healthy child began throwing up at every meal. Physicians at several Northeastern pediatric teaching hospitals told the Massaros that the cause was a digestive disorder and, later, a food allergy.

In December of 2004, when Marco was 17 months old, the Massaros moved to St. Lucie West. It was only after the family came to Miami Children's that they learned what so many other doctors and hospitals had failed to discover: Little Marco was struggling to function with a tumor the size of an orange in his brain.

Surgery was performed days later by Dr. Sanjiv Bhatia of the Brain Institute's world-renowned neurosurgical team, and today, 20-month old Marco is recovering well and meeting all his developmental milestones.


disorder experts, neuro-radiologists, neuro-physiologists, neuropharmacologists, neuro-psychiatrists and more.

In addition, the team collaborates with university scientists and industry partners to develop new state-of-the-art evaluation and treatment technologies. 
